Materials for Indoor Oil Painting Class and /or Outdoor Painting Class - Liz Bonham

You will need the following colors as a minimum to start: (This is a classical limited palette)

Cadmium Red Light Hue Ultramarine Blue Lemon Yellow

Alizarin Crimson (dark red) Cobalt Blue Hue Permelba Brand White

Cadmium Yellow Medium (the Winton brand is too orange, so try another brand like Grumbacher for this color)

Other colors that are not required but nice to have as needed are Thalo Green (blue shade), yellow ochre, transparent red oxide, cadmium orange hue

When you see "Hue" on the name it is usually a cheaper synthetic mix of the color.

Winton Oils are the most reasonably priced, but any brand will work, Except for the white as specified.

- Rectified linseed oil (Grumbacher is the most popular and easy to find.), squirt bottle
- 1 roll of VIVA paper towels- In this case brand matters!(+old plastic grocery bag for used paper towels)
- ODORLESS Turpentine- please do not bring regular turpentine, large jar with lid for turp
- #2 and #4 natural bristle brush Filbert (shape)-(I like Robert Simmons available at Aaron Brothers)
- 1 Round detail brush to sign your name size 0,00,or 000
- It is nice to have a #6 or 8 Bright (shape) but it is not required.
- The studio has some table easels. If you have an easel, bring it.
- 3 11x14 canvas boards (you can go up to 12x16 if you like)
- Brush cleaner some kind of value finder and composition finder is nice to have
- Razor scraper if using a palette of plate glass or plexiglass palette knife for mixing
- Palette- I use ¼" plate glass that is 11x28with masking tape around the edges so the paint stays on glass, but you can use plexiglass too.
- If you would like to use a photo reference, please bring several to choose from that have clearly defined light shapes and shadow shapes and are around 8x10.
